Hot Topic: Quality Counts QRIS	Leah Benz, Quality Counts Coordinator and Early Care and Education Specialist at First 5 Sonoma County, presented an overview and update of the Quality Counts program. There are financial incentives for improving on the tier rating Quality Matrix. Seven elements for evaluation are child observation, developmental and health screenings, minimum qualifications for lead teacher/Family Child Care Home, effective teacher-child interactions: CLASS assessments, ratios and group size, program environment, and director qualifications.
