Students work in a variety of activities to continually engage their brain in acquiring vocabulary and, consequently, expanding their speaking ability. This interactive method of developing a language makes the five hours a day fly by. Holding the intention to continuously speak in and use the L2 (second language) throughout these ten days creates a dimension that can rarely be developed when learning takes place in a standard foreign language classroom for only one or two hours, once or twice a week.
