CHILD CARE PLANNING COUNCIL

- Plan for child care and development services based on the needs of all families in Sonoma County.
- Provide a forum to address the child care needs of all families in the community for all types of child care, both subsidized and unsubsidized.
- Complete countywide Needs Assessment and Child Care Plan every 5 years.
- Complete funding priorities by zip code annually.
- Facilitate Voluntary Transfer of Funds for state funded contractors with the CDE.
- Administer the Sonoma County Child Care Subsidy Pilot that allows for local flexibilities, policy changes and reimbursement rate increases.

2019-2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS :

- Conducted parent and child care provider focus groups as a part of the Preschool Development Grant.
- Awarded the Quality Counts California Workforce Pathways Grant.
- Awarded the Inclusive Early Education and Expansion Program (IEEEP) Grant.
- Contributed funding towards a local ECE Workforce Study being conducted by the Center for the Study of Child Care Employment, Institute of Industrial Relations, University of California Berkeley in collaboration with First 5 Sonoma County and other local organizations such as the Community Foundation Sonoma County and 4Cs.
- Contributed funding to support providers during COVID-19.

QCC WORKFORCE PATHWAYS

- The Quality Counts California Workforce Pathways grant will be used to augment and expand the CARES Quality Counts program.
- Provide financial incentives (scholarships and stipends) for professional development to educators working in Early Care and Education programs. The program will be expanded to include Family, Friend and Neighbors (FFNs) providing child care to families receiving a child care subsidy. The program will focus on connecting FFNs to the Child Care Initiative Project (CCIP).

2019-2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR AB 212 - CRET:

- A total of **34 AB 212** eligible participants enrolled in the CARES program, of which **31 (91%)** successfully completed the program. **16** of those participants were paid out of AB 212 funds.
- **48** AB 212 eligible staff participated in the AB 212 Professional Development Program (AB 212 PDP).
 - **95%** of the AB 212 PDP participants reported that the activities increased their skills and knowledge in ECE.
 - **91%** of the AB 212 PDP participants reported that they were more likely to continue working for the same employer.
 - **91%** of the AB 212 PDP participants reported that they would immediately use the new ideas/skills gained from the conference.

QUALITY COUNTS SONOMA CARES

- Encourage and reward continued professional development through education by providing financial incentives to educators working with 0-5 year old children in Early Care and Education programs including private, subsidized and Family, Friend, and Neighbors (FFNs).
- Priority is given to educators working in programs that are participating in the local Quality Counts - QIRS program.

Partnership between the Mentor Director Program administered by the Santa Rosa Junior College to offer Peer Networking Cohort support to students.

2019-2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- **6** participants earned degrees (5 AA/AS & 1 BA/BS)
- **89%** (62 OUT OF 73) of participants successfully completed the program and received a scholarship/stipend.
- Successful participants completed a total of **685 units** (ECE, GE/ESL/Basic Skills/ and BA/MA)
- **93%** of participants reported CARES encouraged them to stay in the field of ECE.
- **96%** of participants reported CARES encouraged them to take college courses toward the completion of a degree.
- **66%** of ECE educators identified as Hispanic/Latino, 27% as White, 4% as Asian, 1% as Black/African American and 1% declined to state.



QUALITY COUNTS ASSESSMENTS

- Provide external Environment Rating Scale (ERS) and Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) assessments countywide to CSPP sites participating in Quality Counts - QIRS.
- ERS AND CLASS tools are used to measure quality based on materials in an environment and teacher-child interactions.
- 5 contracts are in place with independent consultants (Assessors) to provide assessments.
- Ratings for California State Preschool Program (CSPP) Block Grant.

INCLUSIVE EARLY EDUCATION AND EXPANSION PROGRAM (IEEEP)

- The Sonoma County Office of Education (SCOE)/Child Care Planning Council of Sonoma County (CCPC) received a \$656,587.86 grant this June from the CDE to promote and develop inclusive preschool programs in Sonoma County.
- The IEEEP grant will improve local preschool programs by offering a unique opportunity for collaboration between special education and general education ECE professionals.
- In addition to professional development, the grant will also increase the number of slots for preschoolers with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), expand staff-to-student ratios, and purchase adaptive classroom and playground equipment for children with disabilities.

TOTAL FUNDING AMOUNT: \$656,587.86

GRANT PERIOD: July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2024.

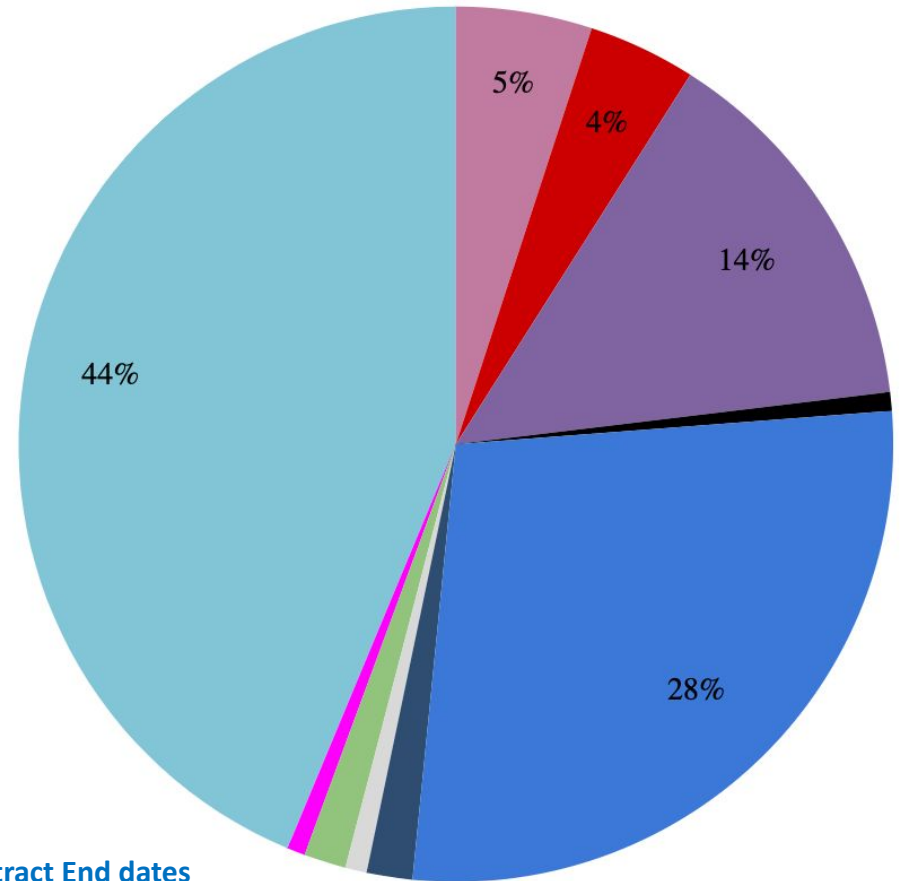
